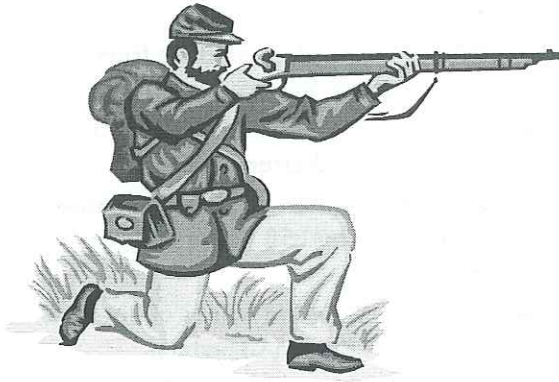

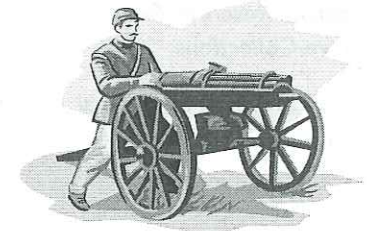

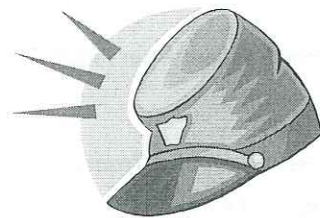

Original archival collections are divided into two categories: small collections and manuscript collections.

Small collections usually fit into a folder, while manuscript collections fill at least one box.

- SC1050: 11th OVI Material, Company B (contains inspection book for company with names)
- SC4653 "Miami County Rouzers," Co. E, 44th OVI roster
- SC4755: Civil War Soldiers from Piqua, OH at Shiloh
- SC4647: Charter of GAR Post #1, Piqua (list of charter members)
- SC4647: Charter of GAR Alexander-Mitchell Post #158 (list of charter members)
- SC4433: Map and names of veterans buried in Johnston Cemetery
- SC917: 1st OVI Muster Roll
- SC918: 110th OVI Muster Rolls
- SC3489: Co. A, 110th OVI detailed roster
- SC1807: Roster of veterans buried in Shelby County
- SC1967: Civil War Memoir of Capt. A.M. Bowdle, Commander of 12th USCT, "Tramping Over the Southern Confederacy"

Manuscript Collections:

- MS1: Piqua Female Bible Society (Charitable organization organized in Piqua in 1818, contains lists of women's names during Civil War)
- MS23: Alexander-Mitchell Post #158 GAR (contains burial records 1838-1923, lists of members and meeting minutes 1917-1929)
- MS37: Anna D. Clarkson Tent #112, Daughters of Union Veterans (contains membership records, including information on women's sponsors into the DUV, and information on Piqua Civil War veterans)
- MS119: 11th OVI Collection (includes general orders from commander, statistics, and detailed list of members of Company F)
